Abstract Topics

Abstract submissions are welcomed across a broad spectrum of subjects. It is essential to select the appropriate topic to ensure accurate evaluation of the abstract. The content of the abstract should be directly relevant to the chosen topic from the followings or closely related.

- 1. Higher education in Bhutan**
 - Higher education & AI
 - Student demographics and enrolment pattern
 - Future direction, national strategies, and challenges
 - Higher education and technology
- 2. Development and domestic job market in Bhutan**
 - Qualification/skills and employability
 - Current and future job market
 - Emerging industries and technologies, and their potential impact
 - Entrepreneurship and innovation
- 3. Global higher education trend and job market**
 - International education and student mobility
 - International collaboration and research
 - Higher education and emerging technologies
 - Future qualification and skills
 - Artificial intelligence and global job market
 - Industry and academic co-designing
- 4. Open category**
 - Knowledge and skills repatriation (Brain Gain)
 - Healthcare quality
 - Information technology
 - Space and nuclear technology
 - Agriculture
 - Youth and migration

General Guidelines:

- For standardization, the abstract should not exceed a maximum of 4000 characters, inclusive of author details, titles, and non-visible characters like spaces and line breaks.
- Abstracts and posters presented or published in another conference or publication are discouraged.
- Submitting an abstract/poster signifies a formal commitment by the submitting author to present the abstract (if accepted) at session CrossPoint Events assigns.
- Please ensure that your abstract is free of spelling, grammar, and scientific errors, as it will be published in our conference proceedings exactly as submitted. The responsibility for linguistic accuracy lies with the author, as no proofreading will be conducted.

Abstract Submission Structure:

Title:

A title should clearly convey the nature of the investigation, emphasising, among others, on highlighting existing higher education landscape in Bhutan, domestic job market, future qualification and skills, artificial technology, youth and migration, etc.

Introduction:

The introduction should encompass a problem description, a summary of existing knowledge, and study objectives.

Methods:

Methods should provide sufficient information to comprehend study design, analytical techniques, and statistics employed.

Results:

The result should show clear and factual information that answers the scientific questions. This may involve showing connections between actions taken and the results. You may use graphical illustration here.

Conclusion:

The conclusion should offer study-specific findings directly supported by the results, to guide individuals and organisations in shaping their higher education endeavour.

References and graphical illustration:

While references and graphical illustration (including table, graph, image, etc) are not obligatory, if provided, they will be included in the character count.

Conflict of Interest:

Authors are required to declare any potential conflicts of interest for all contributors during abstract submission.

Presentation

Abstracts will either be accepted for oral presentation or poster display.
